# PROPOSAL FOR MERGER OF UNIVERSITY ARTS WOMEN'S CLUB AND UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO WOMEN'S ASSOCIATION

Members of both executives (UAWC and UTWA) have been working towards merging the organizations to function with one executive, one constitution and joint activities. Although each organization will continue to operate through 2019-2020, the executives elected at their respective AGMs in April 2019 will meet and work together to facilitate the transition.

A single new executive and a new constitution will be presented for approval at the AGM for the new organization in the spring of 2020.

This merger has become necessary due to increased costs and the declining membership of both organizations. The Dean of Arts and Science, University of Toronto, has provided seed money to assist this process.

All current UAWC and UTWA members will be eligible to be members of the new organization. There will be a schedule of fees for participation in any of the activities.

This proposal will be presented to the members of each organization for approval at their respective AGMs in April 2019.

The new organization will be known as UAWC/UTWA.
